## Recycle Now

Recycle Now logo to encourage recycling



## Packaging Logos

Indicating which parts of the packaging can be recycled. Beginning to appear on packaging from major UK supermarkets.



## Mobius Loop

This item can be recycled where correct facilities exist.

With x% in centre, contains x% of recycled material .



## The RESY System

This symbol guarantees that packaging with this symbol is recyclable and will be accepted by cardboard recyclers.



## The Crossed Out Wheelie Bin with Bar

Shows that a product can be recycled separately from other household waste under the WEEE directive.



## The Crossed Out Wheelie Bin

Similar to the WEEE recycling symbol, but without a bar at the bottom. This symbol is used to support the Battery Directive which became part of UK law in 2008.




## Aluminium

This product (usually a drinks can) is made from recyclable aluminium.



## Steel

Recyclable steel, can be placed in a steel recycling facility.

## Glass Recycle

Please put this recyclable glass container in a bottle bank.



## Compostable

Shows that the material is compostable.

## United Kingdom Cartridge Recycling Association

This symbol indicates that certain environmental criteria for toner cartridge recycling have been met.



## Green Dot

The Green Dot logo can be misleading. In participating countries the Green Dot indicates that the manufacturer is funding a recycling program for products with this label. The UK is not a participating country.



## Tetra, SIG and Elo Pak beverage carton manufacturers logos

Found on beverage cartons that can be recycled either kerbside or at local authority recycling banks. Check your local authority for information.
